# CORPUS CHRISTI - PROCESSION -

SUNDAY 7TH JUNE | STARTS AT 2:30 PM

The Feast of Corpus Christi is being observed on **Sunday 7th June**. A monstrance, transported in a vehicle provided by Morton's, will begin the vehicular procession from Our Lady of Perpetual Succour, Rednal to St. John Fisher, West Heath. From there to Our Lady & St. Brigid, Northfield to Our Lady & St. Rose of Lima before ending at St. Peter's, Bartley Green.

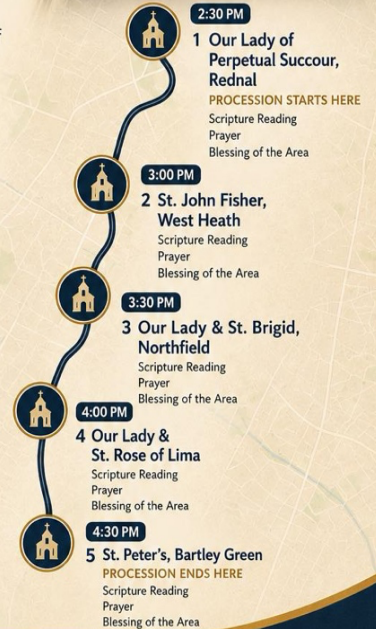
At each church, there will be a short reading of Scripture, followed by a prayer, and then a blessing over that pastoral area.



People will then follow the Blessed Sacrament from 'their church' to the next church.
