

**Welcome to Mass on this Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time!** There are a couple of special feasts during this coming week. There's Monday's Presentation of the Lord, which is also called Candlemas because, on this day, candles are blessed, and these candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World. The feast is celebrated forty days after Christmas. It recalls the day when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to present Him to God.

In the Gospel of Luke, we read about two holy people, Simeon and Anna, who meet Jesus at the Temple. Both Simeon and Anna see that Jesus is special. They have waited their whole lives for this moment. Simeon praises God and calls Jesus a "light for revelation to the Gentiles." This points to Jesus' mission to save not only Israel but also all nations.

On Candlemas, the Church invites us to remember that Jesus brings light to our lives. Like Simeon and Anna, we are called to recognize Jesus in our world. We also look to Mary and Joseph as examples of faith and obedience.

On Tuesday, it is the memorial of St Blaise. The traditional **blessing of throats with Candlemas candles will take place at the 7pm Mass at St Dunstan's**. All are welcome.

## CAR PARK

**Bishop Challoner Playground:** In November, Bishop Challoner made the decision to keep the playground gates locked for security. There is no parking allowed on the playground at any time, so if you come to Mass and see the gates open, please do not try and park here as it is likely you will get locked in and we cannot guarantee the gates can be opened.

**Tablets:** After you have entered your registration number into the tablet, please press go and wait for confirmation that your vehicle has been registered. The tablet also tells you the time you can park to.

**Parking outside parking bays:** Now the system has been in place for over two years, parking outside bays will be enforced by the car parking company via CCTV from next weekend. This includes unauthorised parking in staff bays (current office staff and clergy only), disabled bays and on the double yellow lines. The car park is very busy at weekends, so if you are driving, please allow plenty of time before Mass to find a space.
