Welcome to Mass today on Trinity Sunday. Most of the feasts of the Church celebrate either people or events. Those people we call saints, the heroes of the faith, are celebrated in the observance of saint's days, feasts and commemorations which inspire us in living out the Faith as we invoke their intercession. Other feasts of the year celebrate events Christmas. Easter. the Transfiguration, and last Sunday's feast of Pentecost the commemoration of things that happened - moments in the story of salvation. However, today's Trinity Sunday and next Sunday's Feast of Corpus Christi commemorate neither people or events, but doctrines or authentic teachings of the Church which are held by the faithful as revealed truth.

Today we celebrate that God has not concealed but revealed himself. He has revealed himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit – terms which speak of relationship. God hasn't revealed himself as some distant deity - but as Father, as brother by adoption, as advocate and guide.

This week a group of children of the parish, from St Dunstan's school, will be receiving their first Holy Communion at Mass on Friday morning. Please keep them in your prayers.

Lord Jesus, bless the children coming forward to receive Holy Communion for the first time. May this day be the step forward to a life-long love of the Eucharist. Give them a hunger for this sacred food so that they may turn to you for comfort, guidance and wisdom as they grow into full discipleship. Thank you for their innocence and goodness. May their reverence in receiving this precious gift of your Body and Blood inspire all of us to cherish the Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Amen
