This is a bespoke pilgrimage that is not typically available. Specialist Ignatian Pilgrimage Companies (orientated at the American market) were quoting more than £4000 for a 10-day trip!

For our full itinerary (available at the back of church) of **8 days / 7 nights** it is now bookable at **£1549**.

This highly competitive price is not going to stay around long. The original price was good until this Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> June, though, it has now been extended until **TOMORROW**.

We have not yet met the required minimum number of pilgrims. So, if you do want to come along, PLEASE BOOK NOW!

**Parish Tote:** The numbers drawn this week were 2, 12, 17 and 18. There were no winners this week.

**Booking Masses / Mass Offerings:** There are a variety of reasons that mean that <u>a Mass Intention may not be</u> <u>guaranteed to be celebrated on your desired date(s)</u>. This may happen, for instance, when a Funeral Mass is celebrated and the intention, of course, becomes that of the eternal repose of the deceased person. As such, it is necessary that we stress that <u>Masses booked</u> via the Parish Office – though they will always be said – <u>are</u> <u>booked for a certain date and time on a provisional basis</u>. If you would like to be contacted if we need to reschedule your Mass intention, <u>then please leave a name and contact number</u> alongside your offering.

As a general reminder, all of the faithful are warmly encouraged to offer their own intentions to the Lord whenever you come to Mass e.g., those relating to your work, family, social, and political life. One of the functions of the priest is to 'collect these spiritual intentions/ sacrifices of the faithful' and to 'perfectly unite' them to the transforming Sacrifice of Christ made present to us upon the Altar at Mass.

It is an ancient practice of the Church that Masses can be offered for particular intentions e.g., for the eternal repose of a loved one, for the healing of a sick person(s), and for various other good intentions. They can be offered for the living or for the dead, to assist them in their journey towards Heaven.

Mass Offerings have always been a significant portion of a Priest's income, yet it is wrong to interpret this as simply 'Paying for a Mass'. When one asks for a Mass to be said, this should be accompanied by <u>an offering</u> which eventually goes directly to the priest who actually says that Mass. According to the Law of the Church, Priests can only say one Mass a day for financial gain, and so subsequent Mass offerings always go to charitable causes. Since only one Mass stipend a day can be kept, traditionally, the amount given is 'supposed to be sufficient enough to support him financially for the expenses of the day'. Whilst it is not the *only* means of a priests' income today, it remains a significant portion of it.

The <u>typical offering for a Mass is now approximately £10.</u> That said, <u>please know that if you are genuinely</u> <u>financially struggling, the priests will still say a Mass for</u> <u>your intentions for nothing, or for what you can afford.</u>

Masses can be booked either by using the brown Mass intention envelopes you can find in both churches (these can be left in any of the collections, given to a priest in person, or put through the St Dunstan's Presbytery letterbox), or can be arranged in person <u>via the Parish</u> <u>Office between 10.30am and 12.30pm only</u>. Please note that the cost of the Mass card is an additional £1 above that of your offering to the priest.

The Mass intention diary for 2025 is expected to be available for provisional bookings from Monday  $2^{nd}$  September.

**Living and Praying the Divine Will** continues at 14 Forest Rd, Moseley, on **Thursday** at 12noon.

On Fridays in July, there will be Devotions in honour of the Precious Blood in St Dunstan's Church from 6.15pm - 6.45pm (thus private prayer ceases at 6.15pm).

**Summer Mass Schedule:** Archbishop Bernard Longley has offered Fr John a mini-Sabbatical this summer. As such, he will be away from the Parishes from 23<sup>rd</sup> July - 31<sup>st</sup> August inclusive. During this time, we will have the following 'Summer Mass Schedule':

Mondays, 7pm, at St Dunstan's Tuesdays, 9.30am (followed by Rosary), at St Jude's Wednesdays, 9.30am, at St Dunstan's Thursdays, 11.30am, at St Dunstan's Fridays, (+ 6.15pm Confessions) 7pm, at St Dunstan's

While we commit to the above schedule, some additional Masses may be possible, and they will be advertised on the weekly bulletin sheet – this might particularly be the case with Funeral Masses. <u>There will be no changes to the Saturday & Sunday Mass times during the Summer</u>, though some changes will take place from Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November – more about this in the Autumn.

**Could you help Sponsor our New Lectionaries?** After using our current English translation of the Lectionary for over 50 years, the Bishops of England and Wales – working closely with the Holy See – have mandated a change to an alternative translation of the Scriptures. These will be used at all Masses, Funerals, Baptisms etc. from the first Sunday in Advent 2024, and then for the next several decades to come. The cost for the full sets of these Lectionaries for both churches, plus a copy for use by the parish schools and priests, and all the explanatory materials about this change totals a sizeable one-off expense of £3160.40. If you are in a position to contribute to this investment in the liturgical life of the parish then your sponsorship would be greatly appreciated and can be offered via the Parish Office.

**8 Day Pilgrimage to Rome, Assisi, San Giovanni 8<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> October:** See a vast wealth of religious shrines, ancient and beautiful architecture, Renaissance exhibitions, exquisite food and good wine in Rome, Assisi and San Giovanni. Attend the General Papal audience with Pope Francis and see the four major Basilicas of Rome. The pilgrimage finishes in San Giovanni to see the Shrine of Padre Pio, his cell and where he said Mass. So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.
