Welcome to Mass, and a special welcome to anyone visiting the parish today. Today is National Youth Sunday which is a day to recognise and celebrate young people in our local church communities, whether that be through school, at home, or of course in church. At the 6.30pm Mass today, youth group will be joining Bishop Challoner to celebrate by assisting with the liturgy and music, followed by games in the Conference Room until 8pm. All young people are welcome to attend. There will be an appeal from the Kenelm Youth Trust.

In this month of November, we remember especially those we have known and loved but are now separated by death. The names of these are placed in the holy souls' prayer box that lies before the altar. We also remember those who mourn, that they may know in their hearts the light and hope of Easter. An important part of our November devotions is the blessing of the graves. The last blessing of graves is today, at 2pm, at Wythall, Robin Hood and St Nicholas.

Holy Communion under both kinds: From the beginning of Advent 2023, Holy Communion under both kinds will be available at the morning weekday Masses in St Dunstan's (including Saturday mornings, but not including school Masses). In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), paragraph 281, states that "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident....." However, the GIRM also states (paragraph 282) that "the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even only under one species."

Holy Communion under both kinds will be available at the above Masses but it is not obligatory to receive from the chalice as well as receiving the sacred host. Holy Communion by intinction - where the sacred Host is dipped in the Precious Blood in the chalice - will not be available at St Dunstan's and St Jude's.

Once more extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion have been recruited, Holy Communion under both kinds will be available at Masses which fulfil the Sunday obligation as well.

Next weekend, the beginning of Advent, also marks the beginning of the Church's year. In the coming year many of the Sunday Gospel readings will be taken from St Mark. On the first two Tuesdays of Advent, 5th and 12th December, Deacon Martin will be delivering sessions introducing St Mark's Gospel in the Conference Room at 7.45pm (after Mass). The hope is to provide context and insight into who Mark was and why he was writing his Gospel, so that we can approach and understand the Gospels of the coming year in a deeper way.

St Jude's Church: The work to the north-light window has been completed. Tuesday morning Mass will take place in church.

COLLECT

Almighty ever-living God, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of the universe, grant, we pray, that the whole creation, set free from slavery, may render your majesty service and ceaselessly proclaim your praise.

A reading from the book of Ezekiel (34:11-12,15-17).

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them. As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (15:20-26,28).

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Alleluia, alleluia!

Even if you have to die, says the Lord, keep faithful, and I will give you the crown of life.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew (25:31-46).

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left.

'Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."

'Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me."
