Confessions During Advent. In readying ourselves for the final coming of the Lord, the Church encourages us to make our Confession during the Advent season. Do give some thought to going to Confession during Advent – especially if it has been some time since you last came. After all, Confession is a celebration of God's mercy. As well as the usual time on Saturday morning a priest will be available for confession on Fridays from 6pm-7.30pm. This will be a good opportunity for those who find Saturdays difficult.

GUIDANCE FOR MASS

As the Covid virus is still circulating in our community the diocese is recommending continuing with **social distance, face coverings, and to sanitise our hands** as we enter and leave church.

Although a number of parishes have lifted the social distancing, we have it kept this in place. The spacing markings have now been removed from St Dunstan's, but please consider other people and leave some space from the person next to you. Please also only sit on the pews with the green ticks on.

Receiving Holy Communion. There have been increasing occasions where people have walked away with the sacred host without consuming it. So:

- 1) **It is very important for the respect we ought to give to the most holy sacrament, that if you do receive the holy eucharist in the hand that you consume the host immediately before stepping away from the priest. Please also remove your face covering from your mouth immediately before so that you can receive.**

It is also respectful to leave a reasonable space before the person in front of you. There's no rush, and we won't run out of the Blessed Sacrament

Christmas Masses: There will be a ticket system in place for Masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day again this year. It is not so much about restricting numbers, but with the current climate and the possibility of a winter spike, a ticket system will help us to spread people across the Masses.

Free tickets will be available before and after all Masses this weekend. Two of our stewards will be in the new entrance at St Dunstan's and two stewards will be in the porch area at St Jude's where you can collect tickets. They will be in attendance next weekend too. **Please collect tickets this weekend or next!** One person will be dealing with Christmas Eve, and another Christmas Day.

Please read the following so that you are clear in your mind.

-There will be a different ticket for each of the Masses, so a Midnight Mass ticket will not get you into Christmas day at 11am. Obvious we know – but worth saying!

- You will only be able to get tickets for Masses at St Dunstan's from St Dunstan's and tickets for St Jude's from St Jude's.

-There will be an extra Mass at St Dunstan's on Christmas Eve. *Please understand that it might not always be possible to attend the Mass at your preferred time.*

-Initially, until we are sure of demand, there will be a limit of one Christmas Mass per person/family.

-You can collect tickets for those who will be sat with you in church at Mass, but not for other people/groups. They will need to come themselves.

- You will need to be seated in church 20 minutes before Mass begins. Any surplus places can then be made available. If you come late, then your seats may well have been taken!

- If you have taken tickets for a Mass and then can't go, please return to the presbytery so that they can be redistributed to those without.

- If you have any symptoms of COVID19 please do not attend Mass.

Wednesday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. We will welcome Fr Michael Barwick as the celebrant of the Mass at 9.30am. Fr Michael was with us as a deacon last year during his final year at Oscott. He was ordained to the priesthood last summer in Brentwood Cathedral, and it will be good to welcome him back for this Mass of thanksgiving.

Choir for the Christmas Masses. For anyone who is interested in gathering together as we did recently for the consecration of the altar then there will be a rehearsal after the evening Masses (approximately 7.30pm) this Friday (10th) and the following Friday (17th). It is hoped to have a group to lead the singing at Midnight Mass and Christmas morning at 11am.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY MASS

FIRST READING

Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, ‘Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness.’ Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

Philippians 1:4-6,8-1

My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ,

when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Finally, brothers, we urge you and appeal to you in the Lord Jesus to make more and more progress in the kind of life that you are meant to live: the life that God wants, as you learnt from us, and as you are already living it. You have not forgotten the instructions we gave you on the authority of the Lord Jesus.

Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar’s reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:
