**Second Saturday 11am Mass at St Dunstan's:** Starting on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> February, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at this Mass. After this monthly Mass, refreshments will be served in the Conference Room.

Upcoming Visitation of Archbishop Bernard Longley: The Archbishop will be visiting our Parishes for the weekend of 10th and 11th February. He will be preaching at all the Masses of Sunday that weekend. One purpose of the Visitation to our Parish is to ponder the Diocesan vision as the Diocese moves forward into the future and what that will mean for the Catholic community in our Parishes. The Diocesan vision holds four elements:

- **Evangelisation** as individuals and as parish to be bearers of the Good News of Christ's gospel.
- Formation how the parish can help us all to deepen our understanding of the faith and therefore our personal relationship with God, and to grow leaders in our churches, schools and families through spiritual and pastoral formation.
- Liturgy and Worship invigorating and deepening our worship and sacramental celebrations.
  Encouraging ourselves and others in our life of prayer.
- **Social Outreach** building up the common good through charitable outreach in the giving of our time, our resources and our love to those who need it most. Inviting others to join us in charitable work.

These four elements together are found in each parish community so that as a diocese we will be: faithful to the mission entrusted to us by Jesus Christ, full of missionary disciples who work together co-responsibly in vibrant communities of faith, joyful in their service of God and neighbour.

After the 5:30pm Mass on the 10<sup>th</sup> February, there will be a general Parish meeting in the Parish Centre at 6:30pm. This meeting is an opportunity to be with our Archbishop and to discern with him the vision for our Archdiocese and how it can be implemented in our local area. This includes how we might use our resources and gifts, as well as how the challenge of this undertaking might be shared with other Parishes in the locality, working co-responsibly as a cluster.

**Early Morning Masses on Thursday's During Lent:** From Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> February our 6.45am Masses will resume during the Lenten Season. Tea and Toast will follow as usual.

**Tweak to Thursday Morning Mass Time:** From Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> February the 11am Mass will be said at the later time of 11.30am. Students from Bishop Challoner will be regularly joining us for these Masses rather than the ones on Wednesday mornings.

**Lenten Soup Lunches?** If there are volunteers willing to offer a soup lunch on Friday lunchtimes, during Lent, then please can you contact the Parish Office and we can attempt to co-ordinate a rota.

#### COLLECT

Grant us, Lord our God, that we may honour you with all our mind, and love everyone in truth of heart.

#### A reading from the book of Deuteronomy (18:15,20).

Moses said to the people: 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among ourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth, and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (94(95): 1-2,6-9)

### R: O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts.'

Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. *R:* 

Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us: for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand. *R:* 

O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as on that day at Massah in the desert when your fathers put me to the test; when they tried me, though they saw my work.' *R:* 

## A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (7:32-35).

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark (1:21-28).

Jesus and his disciples went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the sabbath came he went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

#### ST DUNSTAN'S CAR PARK

The ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) Pay on Entry and enforcement is now in place.

- Please park in designated car parking spaces only.
- The payment machine will accept all card payments, Apple and Google Pay but not cash.
- There are two tablets in church, similar to those you see in pubs, where for Mass or adoration on a Friday, you must enter your full vehicle registration when you arrive (this must be within 20minutes of entering the Car Park), and you will be allowed to park for free while attending Mass or Adoration up to a maximum period of 2 ½ hours.
- Parking for Sunday morning Masses will be free without the need to enter your registration number into the tablet, but you must enter your registration number for Sunday evening Mass.
- Following feedback, we have increased the grace period to 20-minutes to help with the dropping off/picking up people to and from church. If a car is parked for longer, they will be expected to pay for the convenience, or they will be subject to a Parking Charge Notification.
