A Lenten Proposal – Fr Toby is ready to journey with a group of adult parishioners that want to go on a deeper journey of *personally* encountering the Lord Jesus this Lent. This is an adventure inspired by the first stage of the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola. It involves a commitment to daily prayer (at least 30-60mins a day for 5 days a week) and typically concludes with a wholelife General Confession (if desired, and with any priest of your choosing) whereby the one who brings the totality of their sinfulness and brokenness is met by the even greater all-embracing mercy of God. Each step of the journey will then be introduced weekly each Tuesday evening at 6pm throughout Lent (beginning Tuesday 20th February).

Second Saturday 11am Mass at St Dunstan's: Starting on Saturday 10th February, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at this Mass. If sick and housebound parishioners would like to attend this Mass but would need transport, please let the Parish office know. After this monthly Mass, refreshments will be served in the Conference Room.

Upcoming Visitation of Archbishop Bernard Longley: The Archbishop will be visiting our Parishes next weekend. He will be preaching at all the Masses of Sunday that weekend. One purpose of the Visitation to our Parish is to ponder the Diocesan vision as the Diocese moves forward into the future and what that will mean for the Catholic community in our Parishes.

After the 5:30pm Mass at on the 10th February, there will be a general Parish meeting in the Parish Centre at 6:30pm. This meeting is an opportunity to be with our Archbishop and to discern with him the vision for our Archdiocese and how it can be implemented in our local area. This includes how we might use our resources and gifts, as well as how the challenge of this undertaking might be shared with other Parishes in the locality, working co-responsibly as a cluster.

ST DUNSTAN'S CAR PARK

- Please park in designated car parking spaces only, not on kerbs or paving, in front of the garages, or in front of the funeral gate.
- There are two tablets in church, similar to those you see in pubs, where for people attending Mass or adoration on a Friday, you must enter your full vehicle registration when you arrive (this must be within 20minutes of entering the Car Park), and you will be allowed to park for free while attending Mass or Adoration up to a maximum period of 2 ½ hours. If you are dropping somebody off in church and risk going over the 20 minutes, we strongly advise you to enter your registration number into the tablet.
- Parking for Sunday morning Masses will be free **until 2pm** without the need to enter your registration number into the tablet. You must enter your registration number for Sunday evening Mass.
- Following feedback, we have increased the grace period to 20-minutes to help with the dropping off/picking up people to and from church. If a car is parked for longer, they will be expected to pay for the convenience, or they will be subject to a Parking Charge Notification.
- Fines: we have received feedback that some people have received fines. If you have made a mistake entering your registration number, please call 0845 121 0065 and choose option 2. There is a long recorded message before you can leave a message. If you have received a ticket and have paid to park and believe you have unfairly been issued with a ticket, please visit https://www.eurocarparks.com/appeal-a-parking-charge/ and complete the online form.
- Please note that the running of the car park is managed by a third party and all appeals/voiding of fines must be made through them directly. As a Church we have opted not to profit from these fines.

COLLECT

Keep your family safe, O Lord, with unfailing care, that, relying solely on the hope of heavenly grace, they may be defended always by your protection.

A reading from the book of Job (7:1-4,6-7).

Job began to speak:

Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service, his time no better than hired drudgery? Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief. Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?'. Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!'. Restlessly I fret till twilight falls. Swifter than a weaver's shuttle my days have passed, and vanished, leaving no hope behind. Remember that my life is but a breath, and that my eyes will never again see joy.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (94(95): 1-2,6-9)

R: Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.

Praise the Lord for he is good; sing to our God for he is loving: to him our praise is due. *R*:

The Lord builds up Jerusalem and brings back Israel's exiles, he heals the broken-hearted, he binds up all their wounds. He fixes the number of the stars; he calls each one by its name. *R*:

Our Lord is great and almighty; his wisdom can never be measured. The Lord raises the lowly; he humbles the wicked to the dust. *R*: A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (7:32-35).

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me.

So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak: I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessings.

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the light of the world, says the Lord; anyone who follows me will have the light of life. **Alleluia!**

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark (1:29-39).

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.
