Welcome to Mass on this Seventh Sunday of Easter. Last Thursday we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord. Even though it was a moment of parting – that the disciples would never see the Lord's face again in this world, they went back to Jerusalem rejoicing as the Lord had promised the gift of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. They gather together to wait and pray along with Mary the Mother of the Lord. The coming of the Holy Spirit wasn't a once in a lifetime thing – but that the Holy Spirit is here to stay, guiding, leading and inspiring the Church. We pray that the Church in our day may be open to the promptings of the Spirit, enabling her to proclaim the gospel in our own age with clarity and fervour.

Reflection - World Communications Day:

Today's theme comes from Ephesians 4:15, Speaking with the heart – 'The truth in love'. In his message to mark the day, Pope Francis stresses the need to listen before speaking truth with a pure heart to "see beyond appearances and overcome the vague din which, in the field of information, does not help us discern in the complicated world in which live." we The Pope, warning against indifference and indignation, hails the example of the great Doctor of the Church, St Francis de Sales, in particular his commitment to patient, heartfelt dialogue. A gifted theologian, his phrase 'Heart speaks to heart' inspired many, none more so than the recently canonised Saint John Henry Newman, who chose the phrase as his cardinalatial motto, 'Cor ad cor loquitur'. Catholics in England and Wales (and particularly here in the Archdiocese of Birmingham) will remember with affection that 'Heart speaks unto heart' was also the theme for Pope Benedict XVI's historic visit to the UK in 2010.

The Sign of Peace. A couple of people have asked about the sign of peace during Mass that ceased during the Covid pandemic. It is an optional ceremony during Mass. Some people are great fans of it, others not so keen. Also, for those who receive holy communion in the hand, shaking hands immediately before isn't perhaps the most hygienic practice. Families/ friends are free to do what they wish of course – but it is those beyond those circles that calls for more sensitivity. Some parishes now have the practice of the sign of peace as bowing to the person either side, or turning to the person either side and saying 'peace be with you'. The sign of peace isn't an opportunity to greet or wave to those you know - that's for after Mass- but a reminder of the disposition of heart required for receiving Holy Communion – that we seek to Love the Lord our God, and our neighbour as ourselves. The most important part of the Rite of Peace is the exchange between priest and people: 'The peace of the Lord be with you always' 'And with your spirit' - in that it is the Lord's peace coming from the sacrifice of the altar that we receive – for Christ is our peace. If you have any thoughts on this, please have a word.





A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John (17:1-11)

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: 'Father, the hour has come: glorify your Son so that your Son may glorify you; and, through the power over all mankind that you have given him, let him give eternal life to all those you have entrusted to him. And eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I have glorified you on earth and finished the work that you gave me to do. Now, Father, it is time for you to glorify me with that glory I had with you before ever the world was. I have made your name known to the men you took from the world to give me. They were yours and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now at last they know that all you have given me comes indeed from you; for I have given them the teaching you gave to me, and they have truly accepted this, that I came from you, and have believed that it was you who sent me. I pray for them; I am not praying for the world but for those you have given me, because they belong to you: all I have is yours and all you have is mine, and in them I am glorified. I am not in the world any longer, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you.'
