Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord is the last day of the Christmas season. Although today's feast marks the event of Christ's Baptism when he was thirty years old, nevertheless it is, along with the visit of the Magi, one of the 'showings' or 'epiphanies' when God revealed himself in the face of his beloved Son: 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him' are the words we hear from heaven in the Gospel.

Although the baptism that Jesus received was the baptism of John the Baptist - the baptism of repentance – and not the sacrament of baptism we have received – nevertheless it is a good moment to remember in thanksgiving our own baptism. As we were baptised heaven spoke about us – this is my child, my beloved.

Although our magnificent Christmas trees will sadly soon disappear, the Crib will remain as a focus for prayer and devotion until the Feast of Candlemas (which was the traditional end of Christmas in earlier times) on February 2nd.

Friday just gone was the Feast of the Epiphany. One of the traditions of this feast is the Blessing of Chalk that you take to mark the lintel of your front door. In effect, it is a prayer of blessing for your home and all who live there as we begin a new year. There should be some chalk left at the back of the church with a copy of the prayer to be said as the door is marked.

There will be a second collection this weekend towards the cost of the church flowers for Christmas. Thanks to our flower arrangers for such a beautiful and festive display!

Thank you to all of those who gave so much in time and talent to enable the Christmas liturgies to be celebrated with great dignity. Thanks to the stewards who gave of their time to help with the Christmas Masses. Thanks to those involved in the liturgies themselves – our deacons the altar servers and our musicians. The church certainly looked beautiful for Christmas, so thanks to our dedicated cleaners and polishers and all involved with the decoration of the Christmas trees and Crib.

Very grateful thanks from Fr Philip and Fr John to you all for your very kind cards, gifts and Christmas offerings. Holy Mass will be offered for your intentions.

Crib Offerings will, this year, be going to 'Let the Children Live'. Fr Peter Walters from the charity came to speak to us a few weeks ago. This charity, founded from Our Lady's Shrine at Walsingham, supports a home life, security and education for street children in Columbia, and tries to draw them away from lives of drug trafficking and prostitution.

Children's Liturgy. Parents have occasionally asked about the possibility of us beginning some form of children's liturgy again on Sunday. On a couple of occasions, we have had an appeal for help, but there hasn't been enough volunteers. It will be different than before in that it will be aimed at children up to the first communion year only and may take place in the side chapel rather than the Conference Room. This would mean that parents wouldn't need to miss the first part of Mass as happened before. There will also need to be the usual safeguarding checks. Is anybody willing to help? A reading from the prophet Isaiah (42:1-4, 6-7)

Thus says the Lord: Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom my soul delights. I have endowed him with my spirit that he may bring true justice to the nations. He does not cry out or shout aloud, or make his voice heard in the streets. He does not break the crushed reed, nor quench the wavering flame. Faithfully he brings true justice; he will neither waver, nor be crushed until true justice is established on earth, for the islands are awaiting his law. I, the Lord, have called you to serve the cause of right; I have taken you by the hand and formed you; I have appointed you as covenant of the people and light of the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to free captives from prison, and those who live in darkness from the dungeon.

God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.'

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew (3:13-17)

But Jesus replied, 'Leave it like this for the time being; it is fitting that we should, in this way, do all that righteousness demands.' At this, John gave in to him.

As soon as Jesus was baptised he came up from the water, and suddenly the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice spoke from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.'
