**Confessions During Advent.** In readying ourselves for the final coming of the Lord, the Church encourages us to make our Confession during the Advent season. Do give some thought to going to Confession during Advent – especially if it has been some time since you last came. After all, Confession is a celebration of God's mercy. As well as the usual times on Saturdays a priest will be available for confession on Fridays from 6pm-7.30pm. This will be a good opportunity for those who find Saturdays difficult.

### GUIDANCE FOR MASS

**As the Covid virus is still circulating in our community** the diocese is recommending continuing with **social distance, face coverings, and to sanitise our hands** as we enter and leave church.

Please consider other people and leave some space from the person next to you. Please also only sit on the pews with the green ticks on.

**Receiving Holy Communion.** There have been increasing occasions where people have walked away with the sacred host without consuming it. So:

1. **It is very important** for the respect we ought to give to the most Holy Sacrament, that if you do receive the holy eucharist in the hand, consume the host immediately before stepping away from the priest. Please also remove your face covering from your mouth immediately before so that you can receive.
2. **It is also respectful to leave a reasonable space before the person in front of you. There's no rush, and we won't run out of the Blessed Sacrament**

**Christmas Masses:** There will be a ticket system in place for Masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day again this year. It is not so much about restricting numbers, but with the current climate and the possibility of a winter spike, a ticket system will help us to spread people across the Masses. For those with babies and toddlers who want to sing God's praises at an awkward moment – don't hesitate to use the side chapel in St Dunstan's where you can still see and hear the Mass.

Free tickets will be available before and after all Masses this weekend. Two of our stewards will be in the new entrance at St Dunstan's and two stewards will be in the porch area at St Jude's where you can collect tickets. **Please collect tickets this weekend!** One person will be dealing with Christmas Eve, and another Christmas Day.

***Please read the following so that you are clear in your mind.***

-There will be a different ticket for each of the Masses, so a Midnight Mass ticket will not get you into Christmas day at 11am. Obvious we know – but worth saying!

- You will only be able to get tickets for Masses at St Dunstan's from St Dunstan's and tickets for St Jude's from St Jude's.

-There will be an extra Mass at St Dunstan's on Christmas Eve. *Please understand that it might not always be possible to attend the Mass at your preferred time.*

-Initially, until we are sure of demand, there will be a limit of one Christmas Mass per person/family.

-You can collect tickets for those who will be sat with you in church at Mass, but not for other people/groups. They will need to come themselves.

- You will need to be seated in church 20 minutes before Mass begins. Any surplus places can then be made available. If you come late, then your seats may well have been taken!

- If you have taken tickets for a Mass and then can't go, please return to the presbytery so that they can be redistributed to those without.

- If you have any symptoms of COVID19 please do not attend Mass.

***These procedures are even more necessary with the increase of infection rates at the moment. The evidence regarding the vaccine and the prevention of serious illness is now very clear. Do think seriously about getting the vaccine or booster if you are eligible both for your good and that of your family and neighbours.***

**Choir for the Christmas Masses.** For anyone who is interested in gathering together (as we did recently for the consecration of the altar) to lead the singing at Christmas Mass (Midnight and 11am Masses) then there will be a last rehearsal after the evening Mass (approximately 7.30pm) this Friday.

**Christmas Offering envelopes** are available at the back of our churches. This is the bi-annual offering (along with Easter) which forms the main source of income for the priests of the parish.

# READINGS FOR SUNDAY MASS

## GOSPEL READING

Luke 3:10-18

### FIRST READING

*Zephaniah 3:14-18*

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM

**R: Sing and shout for joy  
for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.**

Truly, God is my salvation,  
I trust, I shall not fear.  
For the Lord is my strength, my song,  
he became my saviour.

### SECOND READING

*Philippians 4:4-7*

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

**Alleluia, alleluia!**

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me.  
He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor.  
**Alleluia!**

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
