### ST DUNSTAN'S CAR PARK

We are aware there have been some issues regarding the new parking system in place at St Dunstan's Church. We have met with Euro Parking Services to discuss the car park. Hopefully, the issues should now be resolved, and we can move forward.

## This is the response we have received from the Managing Director:

I want to formally apologise for all the inconvenience and frustration caused by this error to you, the Church, and its congregation and visitors.

Here's what we're currently doing (some items have already been completed):

1) Reviewing all appeals with a senior appeals adjudicator to minimise further mistakes.

2) Re-establishing and reconnecting the broken links between the exemption camera and payment machine with the back office.

3) Re-auditing all PCNs with a senior PCN auditor.

4) Conducting compliance audits and discussing improvement plans to prevent future occurrences.

5) Filling out incident forms for a deeper investigation into the system failure (to commence after reviewing all PCNs).

6) Communicating with motorists who received an incorrect PCN to inform them that the charge no longer applies.

7) Committing to carrying out positive and kind acts for the local community and the Church.

8) Printing and installing signs to inform motorists to direct their appeals to the parking operator.

9) Liaising with the relevant authorities regarding this incident.

# A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Peter (3:18-22)

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
