Life-Teen UK Summer Camp at Alton Castle, Staffordshire (Sunday 21st July – Thursday 25th July): Fr Toby has managed to secure 10 very sought-after places for young people of our parish/school community to make use of. This summer camp is an annual event run by our own diocesan youth service, The Kenelm Youth Trust, teamed up with Life-Teen (a US based Catholic Youth Organisation). This summer camp is for young people aged 12-18 from across the whole country. It involves a whole lot of fun (think a day-trip to Alton Towers, Rock-climbing, abseiling, mountain biking, archery etc.), some solid catechesis from dynamic speakers, daily Mass, Adoration, Praise and Worship, Prayer School, and above all the opportunity to pray and have fun with other young people beyond the Parish.

The full cost of this camp is £275 staying in a Castle Dormitory, or £195 for those wanting to Camp (including transport). We would like to subsidise this cost both from existing Youth Club Funds and from some fundraising in the near future. But for now, to secure your place could you book via the Parish Office with a name, contact number and a £50 deposit per person ASAP.

COLLECT

By your help, we beseech you, Lord our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for the world, your Son handed himself over to death.

A reading from the book of Jeremiah (31:31-34).

See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel (and the House of Judah), but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine. so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No. this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive - it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks - since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you, most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!' A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' People standing by, who heard this. said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. 'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.' By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
