Gaudete – 'Rejoice' is the theme of the liturgy today as the celebration of the birth of the Saviour grows ever closer.

Today is also the Family Mass at St Jude's at 9.15am and St Dunstan's at 10.30am during which there will be the Blessing of the Bambinelli. This is custom spread by Pope St John Paul when, in 1978, the children of the city of Rome were encouraged to bring the baby Jesus from their home nativity sets to the Pope to be blessed on Gaudete Sunday – the 3rd Sunday of Advent. We haven't gone as far as Rome today, but the Bambinelli will be blessed here! Many of you may also have brought the Christ-child from your home nativity sets which can be blessed with those made by the children. This simple Advent practice is a way in which we can connect our nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas in church. The prayer of blessing that we will use was composed by Pope Benedict, and it will ask that: 'with your blessing, these images of Jesus, who is about to come among us, may be a sign of your presence and love in our homes.'

Family Mass on Christmas Eve (5pm at St Dunstan's): Mass will begin with a Pop-up Nativity (no practice needed!). All children are encouraged to come dressed up as their favourite Nativity character (Mary, Joseph, kings, shepherds, angels or even the donkey!). Children and staff from St Alban's School will be coming to help lead the music at this Mass, but all young people, and those young at heart, are very welcome to join us. Towards the end of Mass, the baby Jesus shall be placed in the crib and some extra Christmas carols will be sung.

Christmas Mass Cards are available from both churches this weekend.

Christmas Offering Envelopes are available at the back of both churches. Do please use them – especially if you are away at Christmas and wish to make a donation towards the support of your priests.

St Dunstan's School Carol Concert this Wednesday at 5pm in St Dunstan's Church. Please do come along and enjoy the children's festive singing.

This Thursday at 6.45am there is the third candlelit early morning Mass - *Rorate Caeli* - of this Advent season. If you haven't been to this Mass, and you have an opportunity, do come! There has been a good number coming to breakfast after Mass as well.

ST DUNSTAN'S CAR PARK - UPDATE

We would like to bring to your attention that the parking management regime at St Dunstan's Church car park has been reviewed and will shortly be upgraded to an ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) Pay on Entry solution managed by Euro Parking Services 24 hours per day.

<u>Due to unexpected installation challenges, this will now be in place from 00.01am on Tuesday 2nd January.</u>

The church is currently experiencing many parking issues such as non-payment, parking on pavements and in front of priest's garages, overstays, confrontational motorists, lack of space and availability due to the sheer volume of cars that frequently use the parking facilities, and, most recently, theft of car park money.

We have instructed EPS to manage the parking facilities with a technology-based solution that will help reduce the aforementioned issues. The ANPR camera will capture vehicles entering and leaving the car park, whilst recording the duration of stay, calculating whether the correct payment has been made and identifying if a valid staff permit is in place.

Two payment machines will be installed to the system and will accept all card payments, Apple and Google Pay but not cash.

EPS will also provide warden patrols to ensure that no vehicles are blocking access routes, parking on pavements, disabled bays, and staff parking bays at the church. Car Park Attendants will assist members of the public with the new system to begin with. There will be a tablet in church, similar to those you see in pubs, where for Mass, you will be able to enter your full vehicle registration and be allowed to park for free while attending Mass up to a maximum period of 2 ½ hours. For example, if you arrive at 9am to go to Monday morning Mass, you will have free parking up to 11.30am (the camera will log the time you enter the car park and you must enter your registration plate into the tablet).

Parking for Sunday morning Masses will be free without the need to enter your registration number into the tablet. We will have the facility to exempt cars from parking charges if attending some Parish events.

Taxis or families dropping off or picking up will have a 10-minute grace period where they are allowed to park appropriately, for free, only whilst dropping off/picking up to and from church. If they park for longer, they will be expected to pay for the convenience.

Any vehicle that parks for longer than 10 minutes, without a valid permit or paid for parking session will be subject to a PCN (Parking Charge Notification). The PCN is £100 reduced to £60 if paid within 14 days and will also carry a right to appeal if the motorists feels as though they have been issued the PCN incorrectly, has had an emergency or broken down.

COLLECT

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John (1:6-8,19-28).

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.' Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
