Welcome to Mass as we begin the most important and sacred week of the year – Holy Week. Today we commemorate the triumphant entry of Christ into Jerusalem, and so for the morning Masses we begin outside. The people tore branches from the palm trees to greet Jesus as he entered the holy city, as they would for a king or champion. We too carry palm branches in procession as Mass begins in honour of Christ the King. Palm Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday as we hear proclaimed for the first time this week the Gospel of the Lord's Passion.

**Do make this week holy!** On Tuesday, there is our **Penitential Service** where there will be extra priests coming to St Dunstan's to hear confessions. There are also Penitential Services this week at Our Lady of Lourdes, Yardley Wood, tomorrow (Monday) at 7pm, and at Ss Helen and Joseph, Kings Norton on Wednesday at 7pm.

The Annual Chrism Mass takes place at St Chad's Cathedral on Wednesday at 11.30am. At this Mass, the priests of our Archdiocese gather with the Archbishop to renew their priestly promises. The oils for use in the Sacraments for the coming year are blessed and the oil of Chrism is consecrated. Although space in the Cathedral is limited, everybody is welcome. You can also join the live stream by visiting https://www.stchadscathedral.org.uk and pray for your priests and bishops on this special day. We pray also for those who will receive the Sacraments in the year ahead.

The Sacred Triduum (the three sacred days) begins on **Maundy Thursday** evening when, at evening Mass, we give thanks for the gift of the Priesthood and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Following Holy Communion, we process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose where we have the opportunity to 'watch and pray.' Parishioners will come and go during the night. Do play your part in this. The Watch ends with Compline (Night Prayer) at 10.00pm at St Jude's and 11.50pm at St Dunstan's.

On **Good Friday** we stand with Our Lady and St John at the Cross as Our Lord offers himself for the sins of the world. There are the **Children's Stations of the Cross at 10.00am, the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion at** 

# 3pm, and evening Stations of the Cross with the Seven Last Words at 7pm.

On Good Friday and Holy Saturday, by ancient tradition, the Church never offers Mass. At Morning Prayer at 9.30am we contemplate the mystery of the crucified Lord who 'descended into hell' - meaning the place of the dead - to bring the Good News to the children of Adam who have awaited the coming of the Messiah.

At the end of our Lenten journey, we will gather for Easter Mass in a church full of colour and splendour as we exult in the resurrection of the Lord. *'Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us. Let us celebrate the feast!'.* 

Adoration: Please note there will be no adoration of the Blessed sacrament on the next two Fridays.

The Easter Garden Installation 2024: Donations of Orchids are urgently needed by Palm Sunday weekend and across all of Holy Week. Kindly place them in the designated space opposite the piety stall, along with the name of your loved ones on a marker placed in the pot. This garden installation has become "for those you love". These will fill the entire garden and often last beyond 7 weeks. You can also buy an orchid to help fill the garden with colour, perhaps marking a birthday, birth of a child, or a commitment to pray for somebody. Every attempt is made to take special care of your orchids across the 6 weeks of the installation, and they will be returned when the garden is dismantled. Donations of other potted flowers/plants are no longer needed. Across the years we have manged to 'grow our own' and they are sufficient to fill the garden for the first time.

**Brass cleaning at St Dunstan's:** This Wednesday March after morning Mass. We have lovely candlesticks and lamps etc that need to shine for Easter. Could you spare a couple of hours?? Cleaning materials provided!

**Good Friday Walk of Witness**: This year the ecumenical service at New Life Baptist Church will be led by St Dunstan's. It starts at 11.15am and is followed by the Walk of Witness at noon, up the High Street to All Saints. Hot cross buns will be served afterwards. On Good Friday, all those 14-59 who are otherwise fit and well are asked to fast. This means eating only one normal meal without meat, sugar or alcohol and up to two smaller healthy snacks which together are less than a normal meal. We go hungry to express out hunger for Christ.

**Church Stewards:** We have a great team of stewards at both our churches who do a valuable job welcoming people to church. We could do with a few more stewards, particularly at St Dunstan's to remind people about entering their registration number into the car parking tablet. If you can help, please let Fr John know.

**Life-Teen UK Summer Camp** at Alton Castle, Staffordshire (Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> July – Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> July): Fr Toby has managed to secure 10 very sought-after places for young people of our parish/school community to make use of. This summer camp is an annual event run by our own diocesan youth service, The Kenelm Youth Trust, teamed up with Life-Teen (a US based Catholic Youth Organisation). This summer camp is for young people aged 12-18 from across the whole country. It involves a whole lot of fun (think a day-trip to Alton Towers, Rock-climbing, abseiling, mountain biking, archery etc.), some solid catechesis from dynamic speakers, daily Mass, Adoration, Praise and Worship, Prayer School, and above all the opportunity to pray and have fun with other young people beyond the Parish.

The full cost of this camp is £275 staying in a Castle Dormitory, or £195 for those wanting to Camp (including transport). We would like to subsidise this cost both from existing Youth Club Funds and from some fundraising in the near future. But for now, to secure your place could you book via the Parish Office with a name, contact number and a £50 deposit per person ASAP.
