Welcome to Mass on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul – the first Pope and Theologian of Holy Mother Church, also known as the 'two columns of the Church'. After Christ the Cornerstone, these two saints represent an incredibly important part of the Church's foundation and marks an important celebration of the link between our local church to the See of Rome, and to the universal mission of Proclaiming the Gospel to all the Nations.

At Saturday's Vigil Mass (at St Dunstan's) and Sunday morning's Mass (at St Jude's) there will be a Eucharistic procession led by the children who have recently received their First Holy Communion. Please do continue to pray for these children and for their continued journeys in faith.

We welcome into our Parish family August Prosser who was Baptised at St Dunstan's last weekend.

This weekend we welcome the Good Shepherd Company from the Holy Land (Bethlehem) which is based in Nottingham. Their goal is to support and help the Christian families in the Holy Land to stay at work, as olive wood carving is one of the most important sources of income for them with 90% of the Christians relying on their sales. So, by selling their produce here on their behalf, we are helping to prevent Christians from leaving the country in search of better work opportunities. A test survey from the bishops of Jerusalem shows there are only forty one thousand Christians left in the area.

There will be an appeal for Vinnie Holliday, a year 2 child in St Alban's School. He needs specialist adaptions to the school environment to allow him to continue his learning journey in the school he loves with the friends he has made. His mother will join us next weekend at the Saturday 5.30pm Mass and 10.30am and 6,30pm Masses at St Dunstan's to tell us more about Vinnie. There will be a retiring collection at all Masses next weekend.

This is a bespoke pilgrimage that is not typically available. Specialist Ignatian Pilgrimage Companies (orientated at the American market) were quoting more than £4000 for a 10-day trip!

For our full itinerary (available at the back of church) of **8 days / 7 nights** it is now bookable at **£1549**.

This highly competitive price is not going to stay around long. The original price was good until this Sunday 30th June, though, it has now been extended until <u>Monday 15th July</u>.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY MASS

FIRST READING

Acts 12:1-11

King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James the brother of John, and when he saw that this pleased the Jews he decided to arrest Peter as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread, and he put Peter in prison, assigning four squads of four soldiers each to guard him in turns. Herod meant to try Peter in public after the end of Passover week. All the time Peter was under guard the Church prayed to God for him unremittingly.

On the night before Herod was to try him, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, fastened with double chains, while guards kept watch at the main entrance to the prison. Then suddenly the angel of the Lord stood there, and the cell was filled with light. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him. 'Get up!' he said 'Hurry!' - and the chains fell from his hands. The angel then said, 'Put on your belt and sandals.' After he had done this, the angel next said, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' Peter followed him, but had no idea that what the angel did was all happening in reality; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed through two guard posts one after the other, and reached the iron gate leading to the city. This opened of its own accord; they went through it and had walked the whole length of one street when suddenly the angel left him. It was only then that Peter came to himself. 'Now I know it is all true' he said. 'The Lord really did send his angel and has saved me from Herod and from all that the Jewish people were so certain would happen to me.'
